Workshops Guidelines

This document contains information and guidelines for Workshops organisers and participants, within 2026 EuCNC & 6G Summit.

Goal

Workshops are intended to allow projects or any other groups of authors to present their own work. Therefore, Workshops may address one or more Tracks, but they should be organised under a unified theme.

Proposal

The proposal for a Workshop should follow the template, available at the conference website, under “Authors / Call for Workshops” (<http://www.eucnc.eu/call-for-workshops>), indicating the following information:

- Proposer’s Name
- Proposer’s Institution
- Proposer’s Email
- Proposer’s Phone Number
- Proposer’s CV
- Project (if any)
- Workshop Title
- Motivation and Background
- Structure
- Duration
- Workshop TPC
- Previous Editions
- Specific Promotion

The application should be submitted via the dedicated online form, available at <http://www.eucnc.eu/call-for-workshops>, until 2026 Jan. 23rd. In case there are problems with the online submission form, contact the conference secretariat via the online contact form, available at <http://www.eucnc.eu/call-for-workshops>.

Structure

Workshops may include invited speakers, papers, and panels.

The structure of a Workshop is not fixed, and proposers may design it as they think best. However, the schedule must respect the general conference one, i.e., time slots of 1h30, as well as breaks and lunch. Proposers are responsible for defining the full contents of the Workshop, namely authors and presenters.

Papers

Workshop papers can be either Presentations, Extended Abstracts (2 pages) or Full Papers (5 pages) and should be reviewed by the Workshop Technical Programme Committee. These papers will be part of the Conference Proceedings (if the authors wish to do so), but they will not be submitted to IEEE Xplore. It is not expected that open calls for papers are launched for Workshops, in order to attract authors or presenters.

Schedule

Workshops will be held on the first day of the conference, i.e., 2026 June 2nd.

Duration

Workshops will extend for half-day (two conference time slots, each time slot being 1h30).

Evaluation

The following criteria will be taken into consideration for the evaluation and ranking of Workshops proposals:

1. Relevance
2. Timeliness
3. Technical Content
4. Novelty
5. Overall Recommendation.

Workshop Co-Chairs will conduct the evaluation.

Registration

All participants and speakers in the Workshops, regardless of the nature of their presentation, including organisers, must pay the registration fee.
